**Dear Supervisors,**

The **Corporate Work Study Program** team at **Cristo Rey De La Salle High School** has continued to monitor “stay-at-home” order closely in order to ensure the safety of our students, families, staff, and corporate partners.

**Stay-At-Home Order:** On **December 16th, 2020**, [Alameda County](#) and [Contra County](#) shared, “After the minimum three weeks (January 7, 2021), the State’s order could be lifted once the region’s projected ICU capacity meets or exceeds 15 percent.”

**Alameda County:** Taking into account the **Alameda County** stay home order and current ICU bed availability, **we will resume deploying students for in-person work**. As of **January 7, 2021**, the “percentage of total ICU staffed beds” for Alameda County is [25.52%](#), above the 15% threshold.

**Contra Costa County:** Taking into account the **Contra Costa County** stay home order and current ICU bed availability, **students will resume virtual work**. As of **January 7, 2021**, the “percentage of staff ICU Beds that are unoccupied” for Contra Costa County is [6.7%](#), below the 15% threshold.

To continue to keep you updated, our CWSP team will send out a weekly bulletin if any changes arise based on county orders and data each **Friday @ 5pm**.
